Hi Nicole and Liz,

It's come to my attention that it may be difficult to map police data (collected by districts) to community boundaries as defined by the Census, in Trinidad but I can easily see this also being the case in Kingston if not throughout the region. This may well be why there was still something in the contract about addresses—so we could sort the datasets not just using Census boundaries but police boundaries. If this poses hurdles for data security, could you make sure that the resident's police district is identified (presumably by the local firm rather than the respondent), not just the name of their community? It's VERY important we be able to compare reported victimization rates to official crime statistics at the sub-city level.

As for Port of Spain, I believe we want to include the urban centers listed for San Juan-Laventille Corporation on this page: http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Regional_corporations_and_municipalities_of_Trinidad_and_Tobago Could you let me know what the population is of just the urban centers? I *think* it's about 20,000 less than the total for the corporation, which would be the rural folks further north. I have a similar question in to the CSO—if you don't hear back from me by the end of Tuesday, just proceed with this definition for the metro area.
